Community Stream Sampling Program

Since the early 1990s the Community Stream Sampling Program has developed into a respected model of community monitoring and citizen science. Supported by the S.A. Murray-Darling Basin Natural Resources Management Board (SA MDB NRM Board), the program grew out of the national Waterwatch model. Community monitors report water quality results usually on a seasonal basis, and the number of monitoring sites registered in the SA MDB NRM Board region is over 150. While not all of these are monitored on every occasion, this winter in the lower lakes in feed streams catchments for instance, over 40 sites have been monitored for salinity, with the majority measuring nutrient, turbidity, pH, temperature and recording site observations. Some even record biological life through macro-invertebrate sampling.

All samplers undertake annual training and are provided with standardised equipment where a known standard of quality assurance applies. Since the introduction of nationally accredited training into the skills mix, over 150 volunteers have demonstrated their competency at level 3 of the Conservation and Land Management package by successfully completing the module "Undertake sampling and testing of water". Since 2007 the training has been delivered at fourteen locations from Renmark to Narrung, with workshops at Monarto and Milang run this year.

When sufficient data if available it is possible to show an overall integrated measure of group monitoring and make a judgement about the "health" of the site, indicative as to whether it is improving, declining or stable. The integration approach can build in other data sets from other water quality monitoring or even include biological health indicators such as vegetation health or number of frog species present. The Community Stream Sampling Project is currently analysing which catchments have sufficient data to apply this type of analysis to. So far the Currency Creek catchment and the Marne River catchment have undergone an examination.

Data is reported through the community stream sampling on-line database. It is made publicly available and you can visit the site by clicking the link off the homepage of the SA MDB NRM Board website: http://www.samdbnrm.sa.gov.au/.

Feedback is provided to groups via seasonal summaries, which include trend analysis and also appears on the website under NRM Plan/Reporting on the Plan MERI/Community Additional Monitoring Activities.

Of increasing importance to the program are community observations over our diverse landscape and watercourse types. The program is only too aware of the observation skills possessed by our volunteers. These observations can lead to the establishment of new sites or monitoring activities.


